

# NOTICE TO BUYER OF OUTDOOR WOOD BOILER\*

(For Phase II boilers only)

This Notice is required by Section 5-204 of the Vermont Air Pollution Control Regulations. This Notice must be signed and dated by the buyer or lessee prior to the sale or lease of any outdoor wood boiler to be installed in the State of Vermont.

## NOTICE (please read the following information carefully):

These requirements apply to all Phase II outdoor wood boilers sold or leased after October 1, 2009 for installation in Vermont, with the following exception. Phase II or comparable boilers designed to burn untreated natural wood pellets or other pelletized biomass fuels that are sold or leased before March 31, 2010 are exempt from these requirements.

1. Only untreated natural wood, untreated wood pellets or other biomass may be burned in outdoor wood boilers approved for such fuels. It is illegal to burn: plywood, particle board and similar wood products; wood that is pressure-treated or treated with any preservative, herbicide, pesticide, adhesive, stain, paint, oil or other chemical or coating; refuse, garbage or any non wood materials. Home heating oil or gas may be burned in outdoor wood boilers as a starter or supplemental fuel only.
2. Phase II outdoor wood boilers must be located more than 100 feet from any residence, school or health care facility not served by the boiler or owned by the buyer/lessee.
3. Use of an outdoor wood boiler that meets the distance requirement is not appropriate in some areas due to terrain that could render the operation of an outdoor wood boiler to be a nuisance or a public health hazard. Consider your neighbors when installing the boiler.
4. The outdoor wood boiler must be operated according to the manufacturer's operating and maintenance instructions.
